<u>CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY REPORT</u> – Recently the congregation was surveyed on matters related to worship at St. John. This morning a report on the results of that survey is available in the narthex on the table. Please pick up a copy.

NEW BIBLE STUDY OPPORTUNITY! – "The Book of James: Epistle of Straw or Apostle of Faith?" Vicar Shoaff will be leading an in-depth Bible study on the much neglected and poorly understood Letter of James. Martin Luther once wrote, "We should throw the Epistle of James out... for it doesn't amount to much. It contains not a syllable about Christ. Not once does it mention Christ, except at the beginning." Through our study we will come to see, as Luther himself came to see, that this is certainly not true. This Epistle, written by James, the son of Mary and Joseph, the half-brother of Jesus, the apostle chosen by the resurrected Lord, bishop of Jerusalem, recognized leader of the early church, and the one who wanted to be remembered as a servant of Christ is absolutely rich in bringing Christ to its hearers. The Bible study will meet in the north end of the fellowship hall every Tuesday, beginning April 21st, from 10:00AM-11:15AM.

THURSDAY EVENING SERVICES BEGIN SOON - Starting on Thursday, May 7th, the option of a Thursday evening service will be available. Each Thursday through October, worship will begin at 7:00 p.m. We will begin in the sanctuary and move to the north end of the fellowship hall when school is recessed for the summer. This was accomplished in about a year and a half. We still need approximately \$14,000 to retire the debt for the fellowship hall and new boilers. The RHoF campaign will continue toward that goal, although those gifts will no longer be matched. This is a time to give thanks to God for the generosity of the anonymous gift and of all His people, and for the leadership of the Stewardship Board in planning and implementing the RHoF matching and capital campaign.



<u>COMING UP THIS SUMMER</u> – It never hurts to mark your calendars early, so here are a few dates to consider for the summer of 2015.

• June 12-13 (Fri-Sat) --- Marriage Retreat coordinated by St. John along with St. Paul, Liberty Center and St. Luke, Wauseon.
