This Communion service will be held on **Ascension Day, Thursday, May 14th at 7:00 p.m.** right here in our sanctuary. Join us, and be reminded that Christ is at the "right hand of God the Father Almighty," and rules all things for His church – and put an end to *Ascension Deficit Disorder* in your life.


