A NEW YEAR, A NEW WEEKDAY BIBLE STUDY

Starting in January, Pastor and Vicar will offer a new Bible study titled, "Triune God." We are offering a choice of two different times: Monday evenings, 7-8:15pm, or Tuesday mornings, 10-11:15am. The first sessions will be on January 4th and 5th. There will be three sessions each month.

Have you ever wondered what the Bible actually says about the Trinity? Do Christians worship three 'Gods,' as Jehovah's Witnesses sometimes accuse? Why do we have the creeds?
