Installation of Rev. Charles Kramer

It is our great joy and privilege this morning to install *Rev. Charles Kramer* as principal and teacher in our school, and to receive him and his wife, Pat, into our midst.

Pastor Charles Kramer was born and raised in Fort Wayne, Indiana. He attended St. Paul Lutheran elementary school and Concordia Lutheran High School. For his secondary education he attended Concordia College in Ann Arbor, Michigan and Concordia College in Seward, Nebraska from which he graduated in 1976. As a new graduate he was assigned to teach at Immanuel Lutheran School in Gaylord, MN where he served until 1976. He also served as a Lutheran school teacher at Zion Lutheran in Independence, KS ('76-'81), Memorial Lutheran in Cleveland, OH ('81-'89), and St. Paul Lutheran in Napoleon, OH ('89-'99).

In 1999 Rev. Kramer entered the seminary at Fort Wayne to

study for the pastoral ministry, and graduated in 2002. He was called by St. Paul Lutheran, Napoleon where he served as a pastor until 2014.

Pastor Kramer is married to wife Pat and they have three children: Karl (Jessica), Kurtis (Amy), and Sarah. They also have six grandchildren: Constance, Zebediah, Adalia, Matthew, Zechariah, and Zacchaeus.

Following worship this morning there will be a reception in the fellowship hall (*during the Sunday School hour*) where we will welcome the Kramers and get to know them in a more informal atmosphere. We are excited to bring Rev. Kramer on board, and pray God's richest blessings upon his leadership in our school.

Pastors will be trained there not only from India, but also from all the other Lutheran synods in South Asia.



Lent Midweek 2016: Tabernacle - Shadows of Christ

Lent begins just 10 days from now on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 10th. Each Wednesday evening there will be a Lenten Supper at 5:30 p.m. hosted by the LYF, followed by worship at 7:00 p.m. The midweek confirmation class will meet from 5:45 to 6:45 p.m. on those Wednesdays.

This year's theme for midweek Lenten services is, **"Tabernacle – Shadows of Christ."** The tabernacle was ancient Israel's mobile temple, where the priests offered sacrifices and prayed on behalf of the people. In the tabernacle's innermost



room was the Ark of the Covenant and its lid, the Mercy Seat of God. Every aspect of that tabernacle was a shadow of Christ. In other words, what the tabernacle was to Israel, Christ is to His people, and then some! Join us each week as we explore this fascinating structure that was Israel's place of worship for so many years. During the six weeks of Lent and Holy Week, we'll explore the Brazen Altar (where the sacrifices were made), the Laver (where the priests washed for service), the Table of the Showbread, the Candelabra, the Altar of Incense (where the priests offered prayer), and the Ark of the Covenant. Join us each week as our exploration of the tabernacle points us to Jesus, God's Lamb of sacrifice for us!

<u>NEW SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY: MARRIAGE AND FAMILY</u> – Here's a great way to kick off Valentine's Day this year – join a new Bible study about marriage and family! It's starting up this February 14th, which also happens to be a Sunday this year.

What is marriage? Is it merely a civil agreement between two (or more) adults? Is it simply about people who love each other? What is a Christian to say in the midst of a culture so tolerant of a diversity of views?

As Lutherans interact with other Christians, we often struggle to explain our beliefs and practices. We've memorized the Catechism—though that was probably a long time ago for many of us. When confronted with other teachings, we may find it difficult to clearly state our faith. Based on God's Word, as faithfully reflected in the Lutheran Confessions, this study will help you to state clearly what God says about marriage and family.
