

- **BRONZE ALTAR (2/17)** “Our approach begins with sacrifice”
- **Laver (2/24)** “We need to be washed as we approach”
- **Curtains (3/2)** “We approach under cover”
- **Lampstand (3/9)** “We must have light to see”
- **Altar on Incense (3/16)** “We approach in blood-bought prayer.”
- **Table of Showbread (Maundy Thr)** “We approach eating the Bread of the Presence”
- **Ark of the Covenant (Good Friday)** “We finally reach the Most Holy Place”

As we put together all these pieces, a clear picture will emerge of our Lord and Savior who “tabernacled” among us in human flesh, that He might take our place in death and secure for us eternal life. Join us for worship each Wednesday during Lent at 7:00 p.m.

KINDERGARTEN CLINIC & ELIGIBILITY CHANGES for students entering Kindergarten in the fall of 2016! The K-clinic will be held on Tuesday, April 12th beginning at 12:45 PM. There WILL BE Kindergarten class until 11:30 AM on April 12th. **Napoleon Area Schools and St. John Lutheran changed the eligibility date for entering Kindergarten beginning with the 2014-15 school year. The new eligibility is: A child must be five years old on or before August 1 to enroll in Kindergarten.** Items needed for our St. John clinic are: An original and/or certified copy of their birth certificate; a physical dated after August 2015 (*if available*); immunization records; Social Security number; child custody documents if applicable; and the baptism date/baptismal certificate, or dedication date. *NOTE: If your child is enrolled in our Preschool program, we already have the items listed above and you will not need to bring them the day of the clinic.*
