Items needed for our St. John clinic are: An original and/or certified copy of their birth certificate; a physical dated after August 2015 (if available); immunization records; Social Security number; child custody documents if applicable; and the baptism date/baptismal certificate, or dedication date. NOTE: If your child is enrolled in our Preschool program, we already have the items listed above and you will not need to bring them the day of the clinic.
