The new study will begin February 6 & 7 (Monday evening and Tuesday morning). *LifeLight* offers in-depth Bible studies designed to give an increase and growth in faith for all who participate. When you sign up, be sure to express your preference between the following two studies:

- "**Wilderness Wandering**" examines Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy and Israel's wilderness wanderings. In this study, we would examine how they got where they were, how they made offerings, the priestly ministry, cleanliness, atonement, holiness, the festivals, numbers, and the plan to settle the Promised Land. --or--
- "**Parables**" will look at why Jesus spoke in parables (*think Matthew 13:34-35*). From there the study looks at several well-known parables, such as the Lost Sheep and the Vine and the Branches, as well as perhaps some less known parables, such as the wineskins and wise servant.
