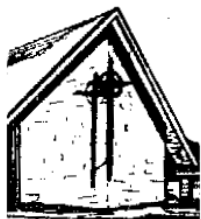

SUNDAY BIBLE STUDIES THIS NEW SEASON

As we approach the 500th anniversary of the Reformation on October 31st, our Sunday Bible studies will focus on Reformation-related topics on which we still need to reflect even half a millennium later. Join us starting next Sunday for these studies. You'll come to appreciate the profound impact Martin Luther had in both church and human history.



A Man Named Luther – Part 2: The Moment (starts Sunday, Sept. 3rd)

This video-based Bible study from *Lutheran Hour Ministries* examines the errant teachings and wayward traditions of the Late Medieval Church that eventually prompted Luther's writing of the 95 Theses that sparked the Protestant Reformation. This Bible study takes a close look at the widespread teachings of purgatory, penance, celibacy, prayers for the dead, transubstantiation, the treasury of merits of Christ, devotion to Mary and the rosary, the institution of the papacy, and the one most often linked to the Reformation: the sale of indulgences.

A Man Named Luther – Part 3: The Movement (following Part 2)

In this study, we will see how the Reformation transformed European society and, eventually, left a profound impression around the globe on culture and citizen alike. Everything from education, politics, science, theology, marriage, and the family – and even extending to one's view of vocation and his relationship to God – came under the shaping and seminal influence of the Reformation. Ultimately, the Reformation contributed a number of ideas that traveled across the Atlantic which, in turn, influenced our Republic via ideas of individual rights and representative democracy.

Sunday School / Christian Education

It's time to gear up for another season of Christian education at St. John. Sunday School grades K-6 will be using the 'Cross Explorations' curriculum that will have them rotating to three sites...

1. **ENGAGE** ~ 10:15-10:25 a.m. in the sanctuary
Combined opening worship for all students, grades K-6
2. **EXPLORE** ~ 10:30-10:45 a.m. in two classrooms
The Bible lesson for the day (K-3 in 1-2 classroom; 4-6 in 5-6 classroom)
3. **EXPRESS** ~ 10:50-11:05 a.m. in the fellowship hall

While the students are in ENGAGE and EXPLORE, all adults and Sunday School parents are invited to come to Adult Bible Study which is held in the north end of the fellowship hall. Then the children will join the parents and adults for the EXPRESS part of the schedule to share some intergenerational, parent-child time doing an activity that reinforces the day's lesson. Meanwhile, preschool, junior and senior high classes will continue their normal schedule. Here's the calendar of what's coming...



- **Sunday, Sept. 3rd** – No Sunday School
- **Sunday, Sept. 10th** - Regular Sunday School classes begin
- **Sunday, Sept. 17th** – Sr. High Sunday School class begins

SIDE NOTE ABOUT SUNDAY SCHOOL NEXT SUNDAY: During the worship service we will involve the children with a children's message and a blessing for them and their teachers as the new season of Christian education begins.

If it is a blessed thing even to give a cup of water to a child (Matt. 10:42), how much more blessed it is give a child the very Bread of Life – to give them Jesus!
