

- Raise kids who are family members rather than dictators

This program got underway last Sunday, but it would still be extremely beneficial to jump in now even if you missed the first session. The feedback is that it's an exceptional, interesting, and very practical program to help anyone who deals with children in their lives. Join the group this afternoon from 2:30 to 5:00 p.m. in the 7-8 grade classroom!
