Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost, for the Jews, was celebrated seven weeks and a day (on the fiftieth day) after Passover. They called it *Shavuot*, meaning 'weeks.' The Greek word for this day was *Pentecost*, meaning 'fiftieth.' For the Jews is a day with double significance: biblically, it marks the all-important wheat harvest (Exo 34:22); traditionally, it commemorates the anniversary of the day God gave the *Torah* (the Books of Moses) to Israel at Mt. Sinai. It was on that day in Jerusalem, ten days after Jesus ascended, that thousands of Jews had gathered in Jerusalem for *Shavuot*. With the sound of a rushing wind and tongues of fire, the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus' disciples. The preached the first Christian sermon concerning Christ crucified and risen, and 3,000 people believed and were baptized. Thus the church of Jesus Christ was born.

Pentecost is the third major festival day of the Christian faith (along with Christmas and Easter). We celebrate the word of the Holy Spirit who, by the preaching of the Gospel, ignited faith in the hearts of the early Christians, and also called us to faith in Christ. "Come, Holy Ghost, Creator blest, and make our hearts Your place of rest!" (LSB 498:1)

THURSDAY EVENING SERVICES are now being offered at St. John through September. We hope this will make is possible to attend worship when summer plans take you away during weekends. Services are now being held in the north end of the fellowship hall. Holy Communion will be available at our Thursday services on the Thursdays prior to our regular Communion Sundays.

WHY DO WE? A member of the congregation has suggested a feature in our bulletin that asks and answers questions about why we do what we do in our worship and practice. This is an excellent idea that we hope will enrich everyone's worship and life of faith. A few of the questions suggested are:

Why do we turn to the cross during a processional? Why do we not sing certain hymns and songs? Why do we use Creeds? Why do we practice "closed Communion?" Why do we baptize infants? If you have a question you'd like to see answered, please submit it using the form on the table in the narthex. Starting in May we will try to make this a regular feature of our bulletin.
