UPCOMING SCHOOL & PRESCHOOL DATES TO REMEMBER:

- Preschool Parent's Meeting & Open House On Mon., Aug. 24 at 6:00 PM there will be a Preschool Parent's Meeting held in the Fellowship Hall for children entering the 3-yr old preschool class. Immediately following this meeting (at 7:00 PM) there will be a Parent Meeting for children entering the 4/5-yr old preschool class. Parents will meet the new teacher as well as be informed about student expectations in the classroom. The basics of navigating in the FastDirect Communication system will also be presented. The classroom will be open and staffed during these meetings. All Preschool parents are strongly encouraged to attend this meeting. Masks are now required when entering and exiting the building.
- School Open House The St. John School will be holding an open house on Tues., Aug. 25th from 6:00 7:00 PM for Kindergarten thru Gr. 8 families. Masks are now required when entering and exiting the building. We will meet first in the Fellowship Hall. That will be a time to introduce our staff members and set the tone for the school year. After meeting in the Fellowship Hall students can drop off materials in their classrooms, meet teachers, and pay fees in the school office.

HEARING ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE: If hearing in worship has been a problem for you, pick up one of the receiver units for our hearing assistance system. An usher will assist you and you'll hear much more clearly. (*Also, please let us know how the system is working for you.*)

WOMEN OF FREEDOM NEWS:

The Women of Freedom were planning to send two delegates to LWML's 28th Ohio District Convention in Dayton, OH on June 19-21, 2020. The theme was "Hope Fully on God's Grace" from 1 Peter 1:13. Fifteen delegates from the Napoleon Zone were eagerly looking forward to this gathering.

The main purpose of these gatherings is mission inspiration, conducting business of the Ohio District, and the important decisions of selecting the grant recipients to be funded during the next biennium (2020-2022). On April 20, 2020, they decided to cancel this convention. The President contacted each Zone president and gave instructions to implement balloting by mail. The result of this balloting was: 1) Support for Seminarians, \$15,000; 2) Support for fulltime Church Workers, \$10,000; 3) Concordia Theological Seminary Fort Wayne Food Co-op, \$10,000; 4) Missionary Couple, Central OH – POBLO, \$15,000; 5) Lutheran Military Veterans & Family Ministries, \$10,000; 6) Orphan Grain Train – Ohio, \$7,500; 7) Braille Workers – Bringing Light to Those in Darkness, \$10,000; 8) Lutheran Family Service in Haiti, \$10,000; 9) Worship Anew, \$5,000; 10) I Was a Stranger – Lutheran Books for Immigrants (partial payment of \$7,500); for a total mission grant goal of \$95,000 to be raised over the next biennium.

Every one of us makes an impact on LWML, and the world, through service and Mite Box offerings. The LWML organization around the world tops \$127 million from all 40 districts and national LWML.

The Lord prepares each of us to trust in Him, to tum challenges into opportunities and to share Jesus love and peace with others. Take heart, the Lord remains in control, as we serve Him together. Thank you for your service, Women of Freedom

SCHOOL NOTES

- ✓ 1st DAY OF SCHOOL for St. John is Thurs., Aug. 27, with classes beginning at 8:20 AM. Masks are now required when entering and exiting the building. Students arriving after that time will need to report to the school office.
- ✓ OPEN HOUSE (Gr.K-8) On Tuesday, August 25th from 6:00-7:00 PM for Kindergarten thru Gr. 8. All classrooms will be open and we invite parents and students to come in and bring in their school supplies, meet their teacher, and pay their school fees. Masks are now required when entering and exiting the building.
- ✓ OPEN HOUSE FOR PRESCHOOL On Monday, Aug. 24th at 6:00 PM there will be a Parent Meeting for the incoming 3-yr old Preschoolers. Then at 7:00 PM there will be a Parent Meeting for the 4&5-yr old Preschoolers. Masks are now required when entering and exiting the building. This will include an overview of the FastDirect Communication information system we have implemented at St. John. The classroom will be open for parents and students to bring in their class supplies and meet the teacher.
- ✓ SCHOOL OFFICE will be open on Tues., Aug. 25th from 8:30 AM 12:00 PM for anyone that wants to pay their enrollment fee and drop off school supplies to the classroom. *Also return any St. John Library books from last school year at this time*.
- ✓ OPENING SERVICE will be Aug. 27th at 8:35 AM in the church. Masks are now required when entering and exiting the sanctuary. Following the service, *Principal Charles Kramer* will welcome our new students. All are welcome to attend this Opening Service!
- ✓ SCHOOL PICTURES will be taken by *Emilie Parsons* of Emilie's Photo Design and are scheduled for Thurs., Sept. 17th at 9:00 AM for the 4/5 Preschool class and Grades K-8; and Fri., Sept. 18th at 9:00 AM for 3-yr old Preschoolers and anyone absent on Sept. 17th.
