

SOLAR ECLIPSE AND THE GLORY OF GOD

Tomorrow, Monday, April 8, we will experience a solar eclipse the likes of which has not been seen in northwest Ohio for over 200 years. As people of faith, we are being given a window into the majesty and magnificence of God's creation and of our own fragile role in it.

Psalm 19:1 says, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands." In light of this, we learn that science is no threat to faith. Science is nothing more than the careful observation and



And there will be no better time to stand in awe of God than in the face of this cosmic event, the solar eclipse. Let us observe it carefully. Let us rejoice in the magnificent order God has established in His universe. Let us ponder how big as God is and how small we are, and rejoice that He is nevertheless mindful of us and has given His only Son to call us "out of the darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). While protecting our eyes, let us be reminded of what a miracle it is that we exist at all.

Tomorrow, we will witness the glory of God proclaimed in the skies. If clouds should obscure our view, let us be reminded of the second coming of Jesus upon the clouds in great glory (Mark 13:26), when sin's long eclipse of heaven's light will at last be over, and there shall be no more darkness. Either way, let us give thanks that we are alive to see this day! For those interested in viewing the eclipse, there are several solar eclipse glasses available on the narthex table. Please keep your eyes protected and be safe!

CHANGES IN WORSHIP SLIDES – In view of Pastor Niermann's pending retirement, it is necessary that the task of preparing worship slides be handed off to another individual. Currently, Pastor Niermann is working on this transition with a member of the church who has kindly volunteered to take this on. However, the transition will require some changes. You will notice that we are scaling back worship slides to the basics – a theme slide to set the tone for worship, hymn slides, and the Steward MINUTE slide for the offering. This means that we will need to make more extensive use of our hymnals to follow the liturgies, and the back side of the bulletin to read along with the Scriptures. To help in this process, a slide at the beginning of worship will relate helpful information on getting your hymnal ready with ribbon markers so that you can navigate the service more easily.

COLLECTING STAMPS: The LWML is collecting stamps "For Missions." A box is on the table in the narthex. Here is what you do: Cut the stamps from the envelopes allowing ½+ inch margin around the stamp. The stamp may not be damaged and the perforations around the stamp must be perfect. You need not trim the stamp. Do not remove stamps from envelopes, albums, and older postcards. An "old" postcard is usually from 1930 or before. The most valuable stamps are commemorative, foreign, and stamp denominations larger than 46 cents. Collecting stamps is an easy way to participate in a mission project sponsored by the Lutheran Women's Missionary League.
