

- **▶ Wed. Dec. 17 You've Got a Ticket to Ride!** (1 Thess. 4:13–18)
- Sun. Dec. 21 Faithful Watching and Waiting (1 Thess. 5:1–11)
- Wed. Dec. 24 Christmas Eve: Rejoice Evermore (1 Thess. 5:16)

Questions to help you prepare for this Wednesday evening (12/17)

Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13–18 and wrestle with these questions:

- 1. Three times in these verses Paul says that people who die in the Lord are asleep. What does this mean?
- 2. It is important to note that the rapture described in 1 Thess. 4:17 happens at the same time as Christ's second coming. Other Christians, evangelicals especially, believe the rapture will come before a seven-year tribulation which is followed by Christ's 1,000-year reign on earth. Discuss these different understandings of the rapture.
- 3. How are Paul's words encouraging to you?
