

# LifeLight Bible Study - The Holy Trinity

We have seen how the doctrine of the Holy Trinity is revealed to us in part in the Old Testament, and more clearly in the New Testament. Yet the Word of God has not entirely quelled the controversies that have arisen around this fundamental doctrine of our faith. In the ancient church, as in our own day,



people try to comprehend the mystery of the Trinity instead of simply receiving and believing it as an article of faith. The result is always error and false teaching. Join us as we take a look at some of the controversy surrounding the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, that you may be prepared to bear witness to the truth of God's Word.
