BYLAWS PROPOSED CHANGES – Recently a committee has been at work reviewing and revising the congregation's bylaws. A copy of their proposed changes is available today in the narthex. Most of the proposed changes are minor and are for the sake of consistency or to bring the bylaws in line with current congregational practices. A brief statement of rationale is included with each proposed change. The proposed changes have been presented to the Church Council and will be considered at the next Voters' Assembly meeting. The four most substantive changes are:

- 1. the addition of a sentence under the Church Council responsibilities that addresses a process for the periodic review and revision of the bylaws;
- 2. the addition of language that allows the first Voters' Assembly each year to take place in January *or February*, so that year-end financial reports have adequate time can be fully prepared and audited in time for that first meeting;
- 3. the addition of a sentence clarifying the president's *ex officio* status;
- 4. the addition of a paragraph under Board of Stewardship authorizing the Board to maintain accounts as deemed beneficial and to submit records of all accounts to the audit process.

In addition, the cemetery regulations have undergone significant revision, again, mostly for clarification. These changes, along with updated prices, have already been approved the Church Council and are available to you for your information.

OUTDOOR SERVICE INFO – Don't forget to mark your calendar, for the annual Outdoor Service on Sunday, August 21<sup>st</sup> (the Sunday before the new school year begins). We will worship at 10:00 a.m. that morning across the road next to the old school building. Please bring a chair with you, and reserve parking around the old school for those who need it most. This year we will celebrate Holy Communion at this service, so we will maintain an aisle for people to approach the Lord's Table. It would be helpful if we could balance the congregation on both sides of that aisle.

COLLECTING STAMPS: The LWML is collecting stamps "For Missions." A box is on the table in the narthex. Here is what you do: Cut the stamps from the envelopes allowing ¼ inch margin or more around the stamp. The stamp may not be damaged and the perforations around the stamp must be perfect. You need not trim the stamp; we have someone who trims and sorts the stamps. Do not remove stamps from envelopes, albums, and older postcards. An "old" postcard is usually from 1930 or before. The most valuable stamps are commemorative, foreign, and stamp denominations larger than 46 cents. It only makes sense that you purchase and use commemorative stamps for your personal mailing. When purchasing stamps, ask the post office for commemorative stamps. Colorful and large stamps are desirable. Collecting stamps is an easy way to participate in a mission project sponsored by the Lutheran Women's Missionary League.
