#### SUNDAY BIBLE STUDIES THIS NEW SEASON

As we approach the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation on October 31<sup>st</sup>, our Sunday Bible studies will focus on Reformation-related topics on which we still need to reflect even half a millennium later. Join us staring next Sunday for these studies. You'll come to



appreciate the profound impact Martin Luther had in both church and human history.

## A Man Named Luther – Part 2: The Moment (starts Sunday, Sept. 3<sup>rd</sup>)

This video-based Bible study from *Lutheran Hour Ministries* examines the errant teachings and wayward traditions of the Late Medieval Church that eventually prompted Luther's writing of the 95 Theses that sparked the Protestant Reformation. This Bible study takes a close look at the widespread teachings of purgatory, penance, celibacy, prayers for the dead, transubstantiation, the treasury of merits of Christ, devotion to Mary and the rosary, the institution of the papacy, and the one most often linked to the Reformation: the sale of indulgences.

### A Man Named Luther – Part 3: The Movement (following Part 2)

In this study, we will see how the Reformation transformed European society and, eventually, left a profound impression around the globe on culture and citizen alike. Everything from education, politics, science, theology, marriage, and the family – and even extending to one's view of vocation and his relationship to God – came under the shaping and seminal influence of the Reformation. Ultimately, the Reformation contributed a number of ideas that traveled across the Atlantic which, in turn, influenced our Republic via ideas of individual rights and representative democracy.
