<u>SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY</u> this morning will resume our study, A Man Named Luther – Part 2: The Moment. This video-based Bible study from *Lutheran Hour Ministries* examines the errant teachings and wayward traditions of the Late Medieval Church that eventually prompted Luther's writing of the 95 Theses that sparked the Protestant Reformation. takes a close look at the widespread teachings of purgatory, penance, celibacy, prayers for the dead, transubstantiation, the treasury of merits of Christ, devotion to Mary and the rosary, the institution of the papacy, and the one most often linked to the Reformation: the sale of indulgences. CIRCUIT REFORMATION SERVICE - TODAY at 5 p.m.

500 years ago this October 31st, Dr. Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses to the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany and unwittingly sparked a reformation of the church of his day and for all time. God used Luther mightily to bring the Gospel out of darkness into the light, and 500 years later we are the heirs of his work, writings and teachings.

Today at 5:00 p.m. the congregations of our circuit will be celebrating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in a special joint worship service at St. Paul Lutheran in Napoleon. This special service includes...

COLLECTING OLD BIBLES: Our school continues to work on a service project. We would ask that you look around your homes for any unused Bibles. What next, you ask? Bring them in to the office and St. John School will donate them to Orphan Grain Train. Orphan Grain Train will then distribute them to individuals and families that have had their homes destroyed by hurricane, tornado, or flood. Often times these people have nothing left in their homes. Giving them a Bible that you don't need is one way that we can reach out to families that are suffering a loss. This will be ongoing for the school year, so keep them coming and tell your extended families too.

HEARING ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE: If hearing in worship has been a problem for you, pick up one of the receiver units for our hearing assistance system. An usher will assist you and you'll hear much more clearly. (Also, please let us know how the system is working for you.)

For those who use the hearing assistance system regularly and for the sake of hygiene, we ask that you claim one of the ear buds as your own and keep it with you in your purse, pocket, etc. Bring it with you when you come to church, and simply plug it into one the receivers. At the end of the service, unplug the ear bud to take with you until the next time.

<u>LIONS RECYCLE FOR SIGHT</u> – *How You Can Help?* If you have used **prescription or nonprescription** glasses or sunglasses in your drawers, desks, or closets, you can donate them now! Children's glasses are especially needed. Both plastic and metal frames are accepted. There is a box on the table in the narthex for the collection of these used glasses.
