CENTENARY RINGING OF THE OLD SCHOOL BELL – THIS MORNING!

One hundred years after the old school bell was rung for the first time on Armistice Day, Nov. 11, 1918, we will ring it again this morning in recognition of the 100th anniversary of that day and in honor of our nation's veterans.

Late in the year 1918, in the eleventh month, the construction of our "new" school building was nearly complete. On the eleventh day of that month, it was announced in the news around the world that early that Monday morning an armistice had been signed at Compiègne, France, bringing an end to hostilities between Germany and the Allies. World War I was finally coming to an end.

The armistice was to come into force at the eleventh hour of that Monday morning. While the "new" school building at St. John was still three weeks shy of being completed and dedicated, the school bell was already in place in the tower. It was decided that the first ringing of that bell would not be for the upcoming dedication of the building, but to celebrate the armistice and the end of "The Great War." At "the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" of the year 1918, the bell rang joyously for the first time.

Now 100 years later to the minute, we are planning to ring the old school bell once again at 11:00 a.m. this morning. After a reception in the fellowship hall honoring our veterans, please bundle up and join us in front of the old school building at a few minutes before 11 o'clock for a brief service of thanks to God, including the centenary ringing of the bell.

- Worship at 9:00 a.m. Veterans will be recognized by the military branches in which they served
- Reception at 10:15 a.m. Honoring our veterans in the church fellowship hall
- Bell ringing at 11:00 a.m. Including a brief service of thanksgiving to God

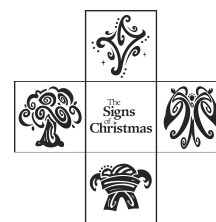
