

SACKING CANDY: The School Board and Sr. High LYF members will be assembling the Christmas sacks today during the Sunday School hour.



What does God want for Christmas? Look in the mirror!

Jesus said, “Everyone whom the Father gives me will come to me, and the one who comes to me I will never send away.” (John 6:37)
