



# PRAISE TO THE HOLY TRINITY - Today is Holy Trinity

Sunday. On this day we traditionally confess the Athanasian
Creed which, more than the other Creeds, clearly elucidates the
doctrine of the Holy Trinity. This creed is "catholic" (meaning
"universal"; as an adjective, "universally accepted") because it gives
expression to the true faith as confessed by Christians of all times and
places. This creed, along with a brief history, can be found on page
319 in the hymnal.

After its careful presentation of the core Christian Doctrine of the Trinity, the Creed states, "Whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity." Why is correct thinking about the doctrine of the Trinity so vital to our salvation? Because historically and presently, those who deny the Doctrine of the Trinity must inevitably deny the true divinity of Jesus (as do the Jehovah's Witnesses and The Way International, for example). If Jesus is not God, but is just a man, then His sacrifice does not avail for us; He is not our Savior, but merely an example for us.

Let us therefore confess our faith in the Holy Trinity, and sing His three-fold praise in the words of angels' song, "Holy, holy, holy is Lord God Almighty!" (Isa 6:4 & Rev 4:8).
