Four weeks from today, at our Mission Festival on Sunday, October 27th, we will present our 150th Anniversary Mission Offering to the Lord and Rev. Robert Rahn of *The Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF)*. Our offering is designated for three LHF projects:

- 1) the training of pastors in South Sudan where the rapidly growing Lutheran Church desperately needs pastors;
- 2) the provision of catechisms for the Bemba people of Zambia, that the faith may be taught and learned more effectively; and
- 3) the provision of Bible story books ('A Child's Garden of Bible Stories') for children in Burma, that the little ones may come to Jesus as He bids them to do.

The challenge of this mission offering is for every household to consider a gift of \$150 for this offering (one dollar for each year of our history), with a total goal of \$15,000. So far we are about half-way to that goal, with only four weeks to go before we present our offering. For those that don't know, *SCRIP* is gift cards that you purchase through PTL for full face value. They work for both in store purchases and online shopping. PTL works through a company that purchases these gift cards in bulk from participating retailers. A percentage of the purchase stays with PTL and a percentage goes to the student's family toward enrollment/tuition. This fundraiser nets the PTL approximately \$300 each year. Think ahead--if you give out gift cards for Christmas consider purchasing them from PTL instead

of at the store so that a portion of that sale stays with St. John Lutheran School. Order forms and program information are posted on FastDirect under 'Links,' titled SCRIP Order Forms and SCRIP Program Info.
