ADULT BIBLE STUDY THIS MORNING Provoking Proverbs * Fourth Commandment

"You shall honor your father and your mother." It is no coincidence that the increase of wickedness in these last days coincides with what St. Paul called "disobedience to parents." (1 Tim 3:2) When children no longer learn to honor parents and other authorities, political,



social and moral chaos ensues. Wise is the nation that teaches its children well to love, honor and respect those whom God has placed in authority over us, starting with our parents.

In our Sunday Adult Bible Study, we are looking at the biblical Proverbs categorized according to the Ten Commandments.
