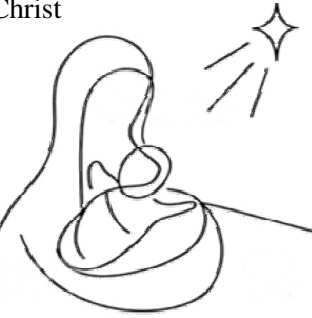

— MERRY CHRISTMAS —

Greetings in Jesus' name, and welcome! On this Christmas Day, the day we celebrate the birth for our savior and Lord Jesus Christ, we turn to him for the comfort of peace. The world has so much turmoil, as does many of our day-to-day lives. But God gave us His Son to be the "Prince of Peace," and God bestows this peace upon his people gathered in worship as they receive His gifts of Word and Sacrament.

What we receive here today ***IS*** Christmas. The word "Christmas" is a combination of the words 'Christ' and 'Mass.' 'Mass' is the old Latin word for the service of Holy Communion. The 'Mass' that is celebrated on the day commemorating Christ's birth is the "Christ Mass" – hence our word, "Christmas." Just as Jesus came in humble flesh and in lowly manger, He comes to us here in the lowly means of bread and wine. Yet faith sees in these humble wrappings God's gift of salvation!

Without the 'Christ Mass,' is it really even Christmas? We are glad you're here to celebrate this most holy day in the house of God, and at His table. ***This IS*** Christmas!

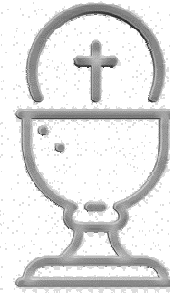

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION CHANGES - STARTING NEXT SUNDAY

The elders and church council, in discussions with the pastor, have decided to try a new approach for Communion Distribution starting next Sunday. The goals of the new procedure are:

- to restore the practice of giving us a little time to be still before the Lord's altar as we receive the Sacrament (*versus a continuously moving line*);
- to avoid using the steps so that most everyone can participate; and,
- to restore the common cup for those who wish to use it.



To these ends, the distribution of Holy Communion will happen as follows:

- Worshippers on both sides will form two lines in the center aisle, with 10 people or so in the line at all times.
- The first seven (*or so*) people in line will split left and right to form a single line (*a 'table' of 14 people*) on the carpeted area in front of the first chancel step. For a while there will be a line taped to the floor to help.
- This 'table' of communicants will receive the host (*bread*) from the Pastor, followed by assistants with the tray of individual cups, then the common cup.
- The 'table' will be dismissed, and split left and right to the outside aisles where individual cups can be deposited as usual, and to return to the pews.
- The communicants already in line will immediately fill in behind the previous 'table' to form the next 'table.' At the same time, more people can step into the lines in the aisle.

Ushers will be available to help us out for the first few times, but eventually we'd like to use this procedure without having ushers involved. This procedure is a hybrid of our previous and present distribution methods that we hope will be a blessing to us all. ***What does not change, of course, is that we receive in this Holy Supper the very body and blood of our Savior, given and shed for our forgiveness and for the assurance of our salvation!*** Let us know what you think!
