SIXTH SUNDAY OF EPIPHANY – Everyone knows the Fifth Commandment, right? That's simple. "You shall not murder." Baby stuff! But do we really know it like we think we do? The disciples needed a little review in today's Gospel. So do we, for the meaning of God's Words are always deeper and more pervasive than we may think.

When it comes to matters of the Christian faith, we never know it all or outgrow it. Martin Luther commented about those who would read the catechism once and then throw it in a corner as if they had already mastered it. Yet even he, its author with all of his advanced academic degrees, knew he needed to study God's Word over and over again. So too with the cross of Jesus. We never outgrow our need for its message. We never exhaust its meaning for faith and life. We never move beyond the cross to "better things." God's Word doesn't change, but we do. New challenges, new situations in life call for new insight and continuous instruction in living beneath the cross as disciples of the Crucified.

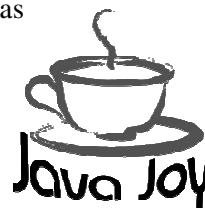

LENTEN MIDWEEK TEASER – Lent begins in 10 days on February 22, Ash Wednesday. Pastor Niermann is planning a midweek Lent series about the *mostly* good kings of Judah. ***We'll start each midweek Lenten Service with a hymn sing.***

So, what do you know about King Uzziah? He's the king who died the same year Isaiah saw the vision of the "Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up." (Isa. 6:1) What led to his death is instructive for us. Though he was beloved as Judah's king, his hubris got the best of him when he presumed to burn incense in the temple, a task reserved for the priests whom God set aside for this holy duty. Uzziah's pride was his downfall, and ultimately brought about the end of his reign and even death. If only the king had heeded the proverb of his royal predecessor, "When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with humility comes wisdom." (Prov. 11:12)

Thankfully, we have a better King by far, who knew His place in the Father's plan for our salvation, and humbly fulfilled His role for us – all the way to the cross! All hail, our Servant-King Jesus! This year our Lenten midweek series is titled:

**"CHRONICLES OF THE (mostly) GOOD KINGS OF JUDAH."


