2024 CONFIRMATION CLASS PLANNING MEETING – This Morning

The confirmation class of 2024 and their parents/guardians will have an information and planning meeting today after the Sunday School hour, at 11:15 a.m., in the church lounge. We will be discussing the upcoming schedule of confirmation related events, and laying out all that needs to be accomplished before that day. Confirmation Sunday is May 19, which this year is also The Festival of Pentecost.

MUSIC IN OUR WORSHIP

- **Organ Music** --- The organ music you hear this morning is from a *Concordia Publishing House* resource called ‘Concordia Organist.’ This digital resource is available for all music in our hymnal, including all hymns and liturgies. After the passing of Renee Petzoldt, who served us at the organ for so many years, the church council thought it advisable to have this resource available should we need to fill in the schedule for our worship musicians. This morning we are giving this system a test run.
- **Church Choir next Sunday** --- We are thrilled to have the choir reconstituted and blessing us once again with their anthems of praise to God. The choir will be singing next Sunday and on Good Friday and Easter. We thank those involved for using your gifts and time to serve God in His house of worship.



SUNDAY BIBLE STUDY – Demons. We read about them in the Bible, and of God’s power over them, but what are they? In a movie, a woman tied to a bed may rise into the air as she speaks in an unnaturally low voice. Her head spins around, and frightening things happen. Does the Bible describe such things? Is this biblical?

Children dress up for Halloween wearing red suits with horns, tails, and pitchforks. Does this reflect how demons really look?

What is definitely *not* confusing is that Jesus has complete power over the demons, as He demonstrated many times when He miraculously drove them out of their victims. This morning, in our current study, *Miracles of Jesus*, we will consider Jesus’ **Power Over Demons**. The coffee is on, and we hope you can join us for fellowship and growth in God’s Word.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL – IT’S TIME TO PLAN

It’s time to begin thinking about plans for Vacation Bible School this summer, which we typically schedule for mid-June. First on the VBS to-do list is to identify a director to work with the pastor to coordinate plans this year. KINDERGARTEN CLINIC & ELIGIBILITY: For students entering Kindergarten in the fall of 2024, our Kindergarten clinic will be held on Thursday, April 4th with the time TBD. There WILL BE Kindergarten class as usual on the 4th. **St. John Lutheran School’s eligibility date for entering Kindergarten is that a child must be five years old on or before September 30th to enroll in Kindergarten.** Items needed for our St. John clinic are: An original and/or certified copy of their birth certificate; a physical dated after August 2023 (*if available*); immunization records; Social Security number; child custody documents if applicable; and the baptism date or dedication date. If applying for the EdChoice Expansion Scholarship, please bring a current utility bill to confirm your permanent residence. *NOTE: If your child is enrolled in our Preschool program, we already have the items listed above and you will not need to bring them the day of the clinic.*

PROJECT CONNECT – There are many free booklets in the rack in the narthex. Be sure to check for some informative reading. HEARING ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE: If hearing in worship has been a problem for you, pick up one of the receiver units for our hearing assistance system. An usher will assist you and you’ll hear much more clearly. (*Also, please let us know how the system is working for you.*)

For those who use the hearing assistance system regularly and for the sake of hygiene, we ask that you claim one of the ear buds as your own and keep it with you in your purse, pocket, etc. Bring it with you when you come to church, and simply plug it into one the receivers. At the end of the service, unplug the ear bud to take with you until the next time.
